Foreign Language Agreement for Students Not Enrolling in Goucher Foreign Language Courses

All students (except native speakers*) will satisfy the FLC GCR by taking 10, 8 or 4 credits following one of four platforms. This agreement is designed for those students who intend to complete their language requirement outside of Goucher, or for native speakers*. Courses abroad for the languages offered at Goucher College will require prior approval of the language coordinator (i.e., Arabic, Chinese, French, or Spanish).

Information about language courses offered at neighboring institutions and about placement exams for those courses is available from the Chair of the Modern Languages Department and the Goucher website. native speaker of a language other than English. Students should request that a copy of the exam and the placement results be provided in a timely manner to the Chair of the Modern Languages Department. ☐ Further, I understand that I must complete all intermediate level courses in that language, ordinarily at the same institution (to avoid complications of changes in curriculum). When starting at the introductory level, this is normally equivalent to 12 credit hours. ☐ Finally, I understand that the only way to ensure that credit from Non-Goucher courses will be transferred onto my Goucher transcript and that the courses will be accepted for the fulfillment of the Foreign Language Requirement is by submitting and having approved, either a Non-Goucher Course Approval Form or a Study Abroad Course Approval Form for each of the courses in question, prior to the time it is taken. A grade of C or better must be earned in order for the credits to transfer. The Department has the option

to require a placement test before the student takes any language course.
