### Remaining Courses

Students will take the following courses at Goucher College to meet their graduation requirements. Students who transfer before completing the **Associate of Arts in Humanities and Social Sciences, Psychology Area of Concentration** may have additional program and graduation requirements to take and fewer free electives.

- Students will need to complete a Data Analytics through the curriculum course=4 credits
- Environmental Studies requirement if ENV5 101 is not completed at CCBC =4 credits
- RPP last year experience
- Foreign Language Course/s Requirement=4-10 credits depending on results of language placement exam
- Study Abroad requirement=4 credits
- Students who earn an Associate's Degree in Arts or Sciences are exempt from the Complex Problem Exploration Course Requirement

### Major Requirements

All transfer students will be required to take a minimum of 60 credits of coursework at Goucher College. A minimum total of 120 credits are required for the degree.
