The majority of the collection focuses on his relationship with Sara Haardt Mencken, a Goucher graduate and notable writer until her early death in 1935.

Biographical Sketch

Sara Haardt Mencken, born March 1, 1898 in Montgomery, Alabama, attended Margaret Booth School, a college preparatory school for girls and later in 1920, Sara Haardt graduated Phi Beta Kappa with a B.A. in history from Goucher College in Baltimore. As a student at Goucher College, she was editor of *Kalends* the literary magazine, *Donnybrook Fair* the yearbook, and *The Weekly* newspaper. Not surprisingly for the studious woman, Sara Haardt graduated Phi Beta Kappa with a degree in History in 1920. She returned to Goucher College in 1922 as a member of the faculty to teach English composition and literature.

In May of 1923, Sara Haardt met H.L. Mencken at a Goucher College lecture. Mencken, 18 years her senior, born September 12, 1880, was already a prominent newspaperman and writer when they met. At age 19, Mencken began writing for the Baltimore *Morning Herald*, and his career flourished with popular short stories, novels, and articles. He and Sara often exchanged letters about their writing and the publishing industry. As a confirmed bachelor, Mencken spurned marriage and kept distant in his letters. However, after seven years of courtship, H.L. Mencken and Sara married in 1930. Throughout their courtship and continuing through their marriage, H.L. Mencken and Sara exchanged over 700 letters.

Sara's health, precarious from a young age, gave her many difficulties. She suffered from tuberculosis and spent many stays in a sanatorium, hoping to recover. Even through many trips to the hospital, Sara continued writing, publishing numerous short stories, articles, and a novel. She also sold the rights to a movie scenario to Hollywood, but the movie was never produced. On May 31, 1935, Sara died from meningitis.

As a memorial to Sara's life and writing, Mencken finished *Southern Album*, a collection of short stories Sara had been working on when she died. Mencken continued his writing career and lived until January 29, 1956.

Scope and Contents

The bulk of the Sara Haardt and H.L. Mencken Collection materials (1886-1951) includes letters between Sara Haardt and Mencken as well as all of her published and unpublished works and other materials related to her career. The series of correspondence between Mencken and Sara (organized by sender, and then chronologically) records their relationship, but also reflects Mencken's opinions on writing, the film industry, Baltimore, national and international events of the 1920s and 1930s.

The collection includes letters from Sara to Joseph Hergesheimer, a prominent writer, and between Mencken and C.C. Hopper, which includes a card from Jefferson Davis and a letter from Stonewall Jackson, both of which were given by Hopper to Mencken.

Correspondence also includes the condolence letters Mencken received after Sara's death, arranged alphabetically.

After Sara's death, Mencken published *Southern Album*, which Sara had been working on before she died. The correspondence concerning copyright permissions for this book, correspondence with the publisher and from others concerning the book are also included in the collection.

Mencken, before giving the collection to Goucher College, had decorative leather cases made and bound many of the materials, including Sara's college materials, typescripts and manuscripts, clippings of published works, notes on *Southern Album*, and portraits and photographs of Sara. These materials remain bound and in the order Mencken provided.

The collection is arranged in eight series. Series I, II, III, and IV contain correspondence. Series I is correspondence between H.L. Mencken and Sara Haardt and is arranged into subseries and arranged chronologically. Series II, Mixed Correspondence, contains letters to Joseph Hergesheimer, correspondence concerning H.L. and Sara Haardt's wedding, letters from C.C. Hopper, and mixed correspondence. This series is arranged chronologically within the subseries. The condolence correspondence, Series III, is arranged alphabetically. After his wife's death, Mencken published a *Southern Album* a volume of her short stories. Series IV includes the correspondence concerning this publication.

Series V is comprised of Sara Haardt's typescripts and manuscripts, compiled and bound by H.L. Mencken. They are kept in the original order and arranged into subseries by type. Series VI contains clippings of Sara Haardt's published works from magazines and newspapers. They are arranged in a rough reverse chronological order by Mencken, who had them bound. Series VII contains portraits and photographs of Sara Haardt. The bound photographs are arranged in reverse chronological order. Series VIII contains mixed materials, including date and memo books, a record of her efforts to be published and her favorite music score.
