Goucher Poll to Release New Results February 20, 21, and 22

Topics include Governor Hogan approval and re-election ratings, the 2018 Maryland Democratic gubernatorial primary, opioid addiction, term limits, and other statewide policy issues.

Baltimore – The Goucher Poll, which surveys Maryland residents and voters, will release the results from its most recent poll on February 20, 21, and 22 at 12:01 a.m. on each day. Results by registered voter status and other key demographics will be included.

Tuesday, February 20 (12:01 a.m.): Approval ratings of Maryland Governor Larry Hogan, President Donald Trump, Senator Chris Van Hollen, Senator Ben Cardin, and the United States Congress; most important issue facing and direction of state; views toward the new federal tax law and the economic conditions in Maryland; perceptions of Governor Hogan's ideology and perceptions of his distance from President Trump; and the most important issue in deciding the vote for governor in 2018, whether opinions toward President Trump are influencing gubernatorial vote choice, and Governor Hogan's re-election chances.

Wednesday, February 21 (12:01 a.m.): Approval rating of the Maryland General Assembly; opinions toward opioids; state government spending on public education and transportation; the proposed ban on youth tackle football; increasing the statewide minimum wage; and perceptions of Baltimore as the economic engine of the state and the responsibility for the conditions of some Baltimore City public schools; term limits; and the difference women make in state governance.

Thursday, February 22 (12:01 a.m.): Democratic gubernatorial and senatorial primary favorability ratings and preferences among Maryland Democratic likely voters.
