Headcount Enrollment







Graduate Headcount Enrollment: Education Programs Only Fall 2003-2012





















Net Investment in Plant Assets, Fiscal Years 1998-2012*



Glossary



GLOSSARY OF TERMS

<u>Credit Hours</u>: This refers to the total credit hours of instruction in which a student is enrolled during a given time frame (e.g., one semester, a fiscal year).

<u>Enrollments/Registrations</u>: This refers to the number of courses in which a student is registered. A student can register for more than one class and have that many enrollments/registrations. If one student is taking two courses, that student is counted as two enrollments.

Fiscal Year (FY): A fiscal year contains the summer and fall of one calendar year and the spring of the subsequent calendar year. For example, the summer and fall of 2004 and the spring of 2005 constitute the individual semesters of Fiscal Year 2005 (sometimes denoted FY05). Fall 2005 is part of FY06.

<u>Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES) Calculated from Credit Hours</u>: FTES is a mathematical concept, a standardized count, for comparing enrollment data from colleges and universities with different percentages of full-time and part-time students. Not everyone uses exactly the same methodology to calculate student FTE.

Undergraduate FTES= Full-Time Undergraduate Students (Headcount) + (Total UG credit hours of Part-time Students/12)

Graduate FTES=Full-Time Graduate Students (Headcount) + (Total GR credit hours of Part-time Students/9)

Total Undergraduate and Graduate FTES = Undergraduate FTES + Graduate FTES

<u>Full-Time Equivalent Students (FTES) Calculated from Headcount (Using IPEDS Definition)</u>:

Undergraduate FTES=Full-Time Undergraduate Students (Headcount) + ((Part-Time Undergraduate Students (Headcount)/3)

Graduate FTES=Full-Time Graduate Students (Headcount) + ((Part-Time Graduate Students (Headcount)/3)

Total Undergraduate and Graduate FTES = Undergraduate FTES + Graduate FTES

Student Faculty Ratio (Undergraduate):

FTE Student ÷ FTE Faculty, where

FTE Student = Full-Time + (1/3) Part-Time (IPEDS definition)

FTE Faculty = Full-Time + (1/2) Half-Time + (1/3) Part-Time

Headcount or Headcount Enrollment: This refers to the unduplicated count of students enrolled for one or more courses during the time period stated. The term unduplicated means that a student is counted only once, regardless of the number of courses in which a student has enrolled. For comparability over time, these counts are taken at the same time each year. At Goucher, we freeze the headcount enrollment file on the fifteenth day of classes. Official reporting and Fact Book statistics are generally based upon the frozen fall headcount enrollment file.
