

REMEMBERING THE HOLOCAUST

A Multi-Disciplinary Student Commemoration of Kristallnacht

In 1938, the Nazis staged violent statesanctioned, anti-Jewish riots known as *Kristallnacht*. Commonly translated as "Night of Broken Glass," a reference to the broken windows of synagogues, Jewish-owned stores, community centers, and homes were destroyed that night. It was a turning point in Nazi anti-Jewish policy that would culminate in the Holocaust.

In "Remembering the Holocaust: A Multi-Disciplinary Student Commemoration of *Kristallnacht*," Goucher students Nadav Marcus '17, Katie Mowrer '15, Gabrielle Spear '15, and Hannah Spiegelman '15 will perform oral histories of the Holocaust. The program will also include music based on the writings of Anne Frank, composed by Goucher President José Antonio Bowen and performed by Professor Lisa Weiss and Charlotte Khuner '17.
