Named in honor of Jewell Robinson—actor, writer, producer, and the first African American student admitted to Goucher College—the **20th annual Jewell Robinson Dinner** brings together members and friends of Goucher's Black and African American community in the spirit of celebration, reflection, and fellowship.

For the past two decades, this cherished tradition has celebrated Goucher's African American community and honored the legacy of Jewell Robinson. We look forward to an inspiring evening of stories, connections, and pride.

This signature program attracts approximately 150 attendees through both in-person and virtual options. More than 40% of guests are alumnae/i, 20% visitors, 30% current students, and 10% staff and volunteers.

IMANI FUND

In addition to an annual gathering celebrating our Black and African American community, this event is a fundraiser benefiting the Imani Fund.

Since 2006, Goucher students have been required to study abroad to enhance their cross-cultural understanding. The Imani Fund encourages this exploration by supporting the study abroad experiences of selected students in the Maryland Scholars Program, a subset of the Maryland Advantage Program.

The Maryland Scholars Program provides first-generation college students from underserved socioeconomic backgrounds the opportunity to experience a life-changing liberal arts education. Although Goucher does provide assistance for study abroad, many Maryland Scholars Program students need additional support. The Imani Fund helps cover costs associated with this formative experience.

Former Imani recipients have traveled to destinations around the world, including France, South Africa, Costa Rica, Italy, South Korea, and Malta, broadening their perspectives and bringing invaluable global insights back to campus.







Marguerite Barland Award

Since 2015, the Marguerite Barland '60 Merit Award has been presented annually in honor and celebration of Goucher's first African American graduate, Marguerite Barland.

This award celebrates one or more alumnae/i who, in their professional and private lives, have significantly contributed to the diversity of our campus community through leadership—as mentors, role models, volunteers, or philanthropic supporters of the college.

Since its inception, 14 alumnae/i have been honored with this award, reflecting the enduring impact of Marguerite Barland's legacy. Last year, Kimberley Gordy '06, M.Div., was presented with the 2025 Marguerite Barland '60 Merit Award. Gordy started her career researching pulmonary hypertension at Johns Hopkins School of Medicine, but switched to college counseling so she could have more human interaction.

Gordy loved the work of empowering young people. "It's always been part of the fabric of who I am," she said. She came from a family of educators and was supported by the adults around her. It taught her that "education as a vehicle for change and enlightenment is one of the most empowering tools for people as they figure out what's next for them."

Today, Gordy works in the spiritual care department at the Hospital of the University of Pennsylvania, in Philadelphia, while training to become an educator for chaplaincy students.
