

Dear Goucher Community:

Below you will find a list of the religious holy days that may impact your calendars during the **2025-2026 academic year.** Please keep in mind this is <u>not</u> an exhaustive list. The holidays included are those that may have a significant impact on observant students and could present a conflict with academic requirements.

Faculty and staff should try to avoid scheduling major programs, fieldtrips, events, exams, or projects on these days, as some members of our community could be fasting, limiting work, or observing the holiday in other ways. Some religious observances require additional time for preparation or travel before and after the actual holy day.

For academic conflicts, students may request an extension on deadlines or may submit a <u>Religious Observance Request Form</u> for a specific absence, which once submitted, will be sent to the impacted faculty member(s) and the Associate Provost for Undergraduate Studies for final approval.

* For most religious traditions, the celebration or observance begins the evening before the actual day (sometimes called "eve" or "erev"). In these circumstances, both days are listed for ease of reference. Work restrictions for <u>Jewish</u> holidays begin shortly before sundown on the first date indicated.

Some holidays in Islam are not fixed to a calendar but based on the actual sighting of the moon and therefore there may be some variance by day.

NOTE: Unless indicated, work is not restricted on these days but attendance at services, fasting, or other observances may take place.
