Topics include Governor Hogan's approval ratings, immigration, and the 2018 Maryland Democratic gubernatorial primary.

Baltimore – The Goucher Poll, which surveys Maryland residents and voters, will release the results from its most recent poll on September 21, 25, and 26 at 12:01 a.m. on each day. Results by registered voter status and other key demographics will be included.

Thursday, September 21 (12:01am): Opinions toward immigration and Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals program (DACA); climate change and hurricane preparedness; wind turbines in Ocean City; and race and society.

Monday, September 25 (12:01am): Ratings of Maryland Governor Larry Hogan, President Donald Trump, and the United States Congress; most important issue facing Maryland and direction of the state; perceptions of Governor Hogan's ideology, whether he represents the future of the Republican Party, and perceptions of his distance from President Trump; and the most important issue in deciding the vote for governor in 2018 and Governor Hogan's reelection chances.

Tuesday, September 26 (12:01am): Democratic gubernatorial primary (candidate preferences of Maryland Democratic likely voters).
