

**ACADEMIC PROGRAM ARTICULATION 2+2 AGREEMENT BETWEEN
WOR-WIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE
AND
GOUCHER COLLEGE REGARDING TRANSFER FROM THE ASSOCIATE OF
APPLIED SCIENCE AT WOR-WIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE TO THE BACHELOR
OF PROFESSIONAL STUDIES AT GOUCHER COLLEGE**

This Academic Program Articulation Agreement (“Agreement”) is entered into by and between WOR-WIC COMMUNITY COLLEGE (the “Sending Institution”) and GOUCHER COLLEGE (the “Receiving Institution”) (collectively, the “Institutions”) to facilitate the transfer of academic credits from the following programs at Wor-Wic Community College for completion of the Bachelor of Professional Studies degree at Goucher College:

A. Qualifying Students

This Agreement pertains to the transfer of “Qualifying Students”, *i.e.*, those students who:

1. Have successfully completed the program at the Wor-Wic Community College;
2. Are enrolled in Wor-Wic Community College in good standing; and
3. Are accepted for admission at Goucher College.

B. Responsibilities of the Institutions

The Institutions agree to implement the transfer of Qualifying Students in accordance with applicable law and the following requirements and protocols:

1. A Qualifying Student may transfer from Wor-Wic Community College into Goucher College for the completion of the Bachelor of Professional Studies degree.
2. Goucher College will accept the full AAS degree awarded at Wor-Wic Community College in one of the ten (10) AAS programs listed above (60 credits total) as completion of the first two years of the Bachelor of Professional Studies program at Goucher.
3. The transferring student will complete an additional 60 credits at Goucher College online with no residency requirement to fulfill the third and fourth year of the BPS program. These additional courses shall consist of the following:

BPS Core Courses (30 cr)

BPS 300	Introduction to Professional Studies
BPS 330	Digital and Professional Communication

4. Goucher College shall designate, and shall provide to Wor-Wic Community College, the contact information for a staff person at Goucher College who is responsible for the oversight of the transfer of Qualifying Students. Wor-Wic Community College shall designate, and shall provide to the Receiving Institution, the contact information for a staff person at the Wor-Wic Community College who is responsible for the oversight of the transfer of Qualifying Students.



5. If the Qualifying Student is using federal Title 38 VA Education Benefits (GI Bill® Education Benefits), the Institutions shall adhere to all applicable U.S. Department of Veterans Affairs' regulations, including the regulations governing the awarding of prior credit, as regulated under Title 38, Code of Federal Regulations, Sections 21.4253(d)(3) and 21.4254(c)(4).
6. Each Institution shall adhere to all applicable transfer requirements set forth in the Annotated Code of Maryland and the Code of Maryland Regulations.
7. Each Institution shall advise students regarding transfer opportunities under this Agreement, and shall advise students of financial aid opportunities and implications associated with the transfer.
8. Should either Institution make changes to program requirements, the institution will inform the partner institution immediately. The articulation agreement should be updated to reflect the changes and forwarded to the Maryland Higher Education Commission.

1. The Institutions are and shall remain in compliance with all applicable federal, state, and local statutes, laws, ordinances, and regulations relating to this Agreement, as amended from time to time.
2. Each Institution has taken all action necessary for the approval and execution of this Agreement.


