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Course Description

This in-person AP Spanish Language and Culture course is designed to maximize the learner experience, providing relevant Advanced Placement content and pedagogy through meaningful engagement – all focused on best practices for preparing your AP students for success. During the overview of the AP Spanish Language and Culture Curriculum Framework, participants will examine the themes as well as the recommended contexts and overarching essential questions for exploring each theme in the new Framework. Discussion will be centered on the suggested units of the new Course and Exam Description and how to use them in the classroom. Some time will be devoted to evaluating the sample syllabus to deliver the course as well as the new resources for teachers and—and how to integrate them into classroom instruction. The Institute also will address issues of curriculum and of Pre-AP* courses. Participants will engage in a discussion of textbooks, websites, and resources available for the course. Scoring Guidelines and student samples will be used for participants to become familiar with the scoring of the free response sections of the exam. In addition, participants will develop a final project according to the needs of their students during the week, in consultation with the instructor. They also are expected to bring copies of one successful activity to share.

Welcome to our Course!

This course is designed for participants with or without experience teaching AP Spanish Language and Culture. It will introduce the participants to the thematically organized AP Spanish Language and Culture course. Participants will examine the themes as well as the recommended contexts and overarching essential questions for exploring each theme in the framework. The participants will become familiar with the Course and Exam Description (CED), the suggested Units included in it, as well as the new on-line resources which give teachers and students feedback during the year. The course will also address issues of curriculum and of Pre-AP* courses. Some time will be devoted to evaluating the sample syllabus to deliver the course. Participants will engage in a discussion of textbooks, websites, and resources available for the AP* course. Scoring evaluation and students samples will be used for participants to become familiar with the scoring of the free response sections of the exam. Participants will also develop a final project according to the needs of their students during the week, in consultation with the instructor. Participants are expected to bring copies of one successful activity to share.

- The use of literary works in the language course
- The transition between AP Language and Culture and AP Literature
- The role of grammar
- Activities for after the AP Exam
- Pre-AP courses and expectations

Learning Objectives

- Be thoroughly familiar with the course, examination and scoring.
- Become familiar with the CED and the suggested units.
- Become familiar with different syllabi to evaluate and tailor to your needs.
- Develop material to use in class.
- Explore the different websites and resources available on-line.
- Learn to use authentic resources as well as their use to integrate the different skills.
- Explore ways to develop and integrate the three modes of communication: Interpretative, Interpersonal and Presentational
- Integrate the teaching of culture.
- Examine different ways to pace the course effectively.
