

Course Modalities for Fall 2020

The faculty are redesigning courses to offer four categories of teaching modalities for the fall, defined below to assist you in selecting courses that will meet your needs:

- 1. IP (in-person) faculty and students are both in the classroom for the majority of the class meetings, with appropriate physical distancing. There may be an online component, or the class may be split into groups for distancing, but there will be substantial required in-person work on campus. You should not sign up for these if you intend not to come onto campus.
- 2. HF (HyFlex or dual mode) Students on campus are in the classroom whenever possible with appropriate physical distancing (whether all the time or half the time split into alternating groups for distancing purposes) while other students who cannot come in person, such as international or immunocompromised students, are remote all the time via an internet connection. Faculty may need to teach part or all of the classroom time remotely as well.
- 3. AO (Asynchronous online) both faculty and students work completely remotely via the internet with all activities asynchronous, without any live real-time interaction at all. These are the courses available to students unable to attend class at a set time.
- 4. SO (Synchronous online) both faculty and students work completely remotely via the internet with <u>some</u> live real-time interactive virtual component, even if there are also asynchronous portions. While students can certainly log in for a synchronous interactive session in the same room if they are living on campus, there would be no expectation of physical presence on anyone's part. All synchronous meetings will occur within the assigned course meeting times.
